
















# Pack 48 Campout Schedule and Instructions

Attached are a suggested schedule and general information for the Pack 48 Campout on November 20 and 21, 2004

Most Pack events will occur on Saturday beginning around 1:00pm. All campers should arrive before 1 PM to allow time to set up camp before the activities begin. We want to maximize the enjoyment of the Pack 48 campout experience. *The Drive to Salmen camp is approximately 1 ½ hours.* **IT WILL BE COLD AT NIGHT!**

First and foremost is the answer to the big question...

## ***WHAT DO I BRING?***

-  Tent – For comfort, get a tent that fits at least one more than you will have sleeping in the tent (ex. If two adults and one child will be in the tent, or One adult and one child, get a 4 person tent)
-  Sleeping bags – Bags are temperature rated. It will not be cold, so you can get one rated for a higher temperature (wear sweats or bring a blanket if you are cold natured)
-  Rain Gear – a simple poncho will suffice.
-  Towel/soap – there will be showers available, if desired
-  Toothbrush/toothpaste
-  Flashlight – (be sure to bring extra batteries)
-  Air mattress for adults is recommended (do not bother for children, they don't seem to notice)
-  Sunscreen
-  Bug Spray (min 10% DEET)
-  Water or other refreshment desired (NOT ALCOHOL)
-  Snacks if desired
-  Camp chair
-  Nature guides
-  Fishing gear if desired (catch and release)
-  Extra socks and shoes and clothes (in case of wetness)

## ***IMPORTANT! DO NOT BRING!!!***

- × Radios
- × Knives of any kind
- × Firearms
- × Aerosol Sprays
- × Electronic games or devices
- × Alcohol

## Message to All Adults:

Salmen Scout Camp is a very safe place designed for all Scouts to enjoy including Boy scouts. Be aware that there are places that are off limits to Cub Scouts and activities that may not be age appropriate for your child. While the scouts should be given leeway to explore and to enjoy the park with their friends, the Scout leaders are only the Leaders, NOT the parents. We ask that each parent check up on his or her child AND other children. All adults should take time at some point or other to check up on the scouts. Each family has different philosophies and family rules, but it should be understood, that any adult has the right to correct any scout's behavior and that no one adult should have to watch all the scouts, all the time.

## Den Leaders:

Each Den is going to be responsible for holding a Den meeting and for handling set up or clean up for each meal and cleaning up the campsite at the end of the camping trip. Below is a list of which den is responsible for which activity. ## **Suggested Activities:**

### **Games:**

*Blob* – A form of “Tag” in which the “blob” grows to include each person tagged.

*Scavenger Hunt/ Treasure Hunt* - Dens or teams can search for specific items or follow “clues” to find treasure (toy coins or a peanut) and the team with the most treasure wins a prize - (I was thinking candy or snack or they could be exempt from the clean up routine)

*Steal the Bacon* - Form two teams in a line facing each other. Each has a number and when called, they try to get the “bacon” (bottle, ball or other object) and bring it to their side before being tagged. Points awarded for getting “bacon” back to your side w/o being tagged and for tagging a player who has the “bacon”. Winning team can earn prize or just bragging rights.






### **Sports:**

*Touch football, soccer or softball.*

I was not going to schedule any Salmen specific activities (i.e. pirate ship, shooting range, etc.) because it is hard to get everybody together for those things. They are better for Friday or Saturday morning unscheduled activities.

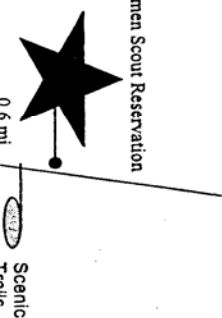
## Campfire Activities/ Schedule

This is a suggestion. I think Paul should plan the specifics.

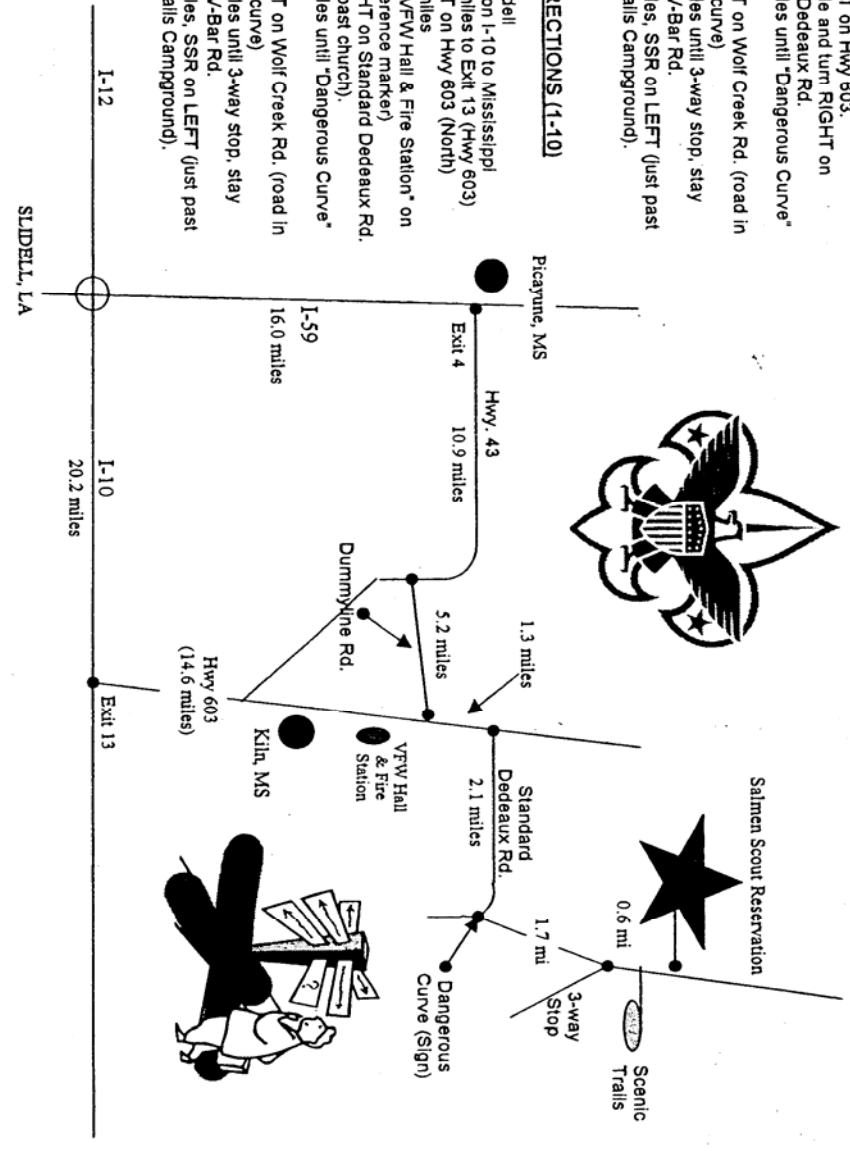
-  Start with a story? (If anyone has a good one)

-  End campfire with a snack (smores is my suggestion)

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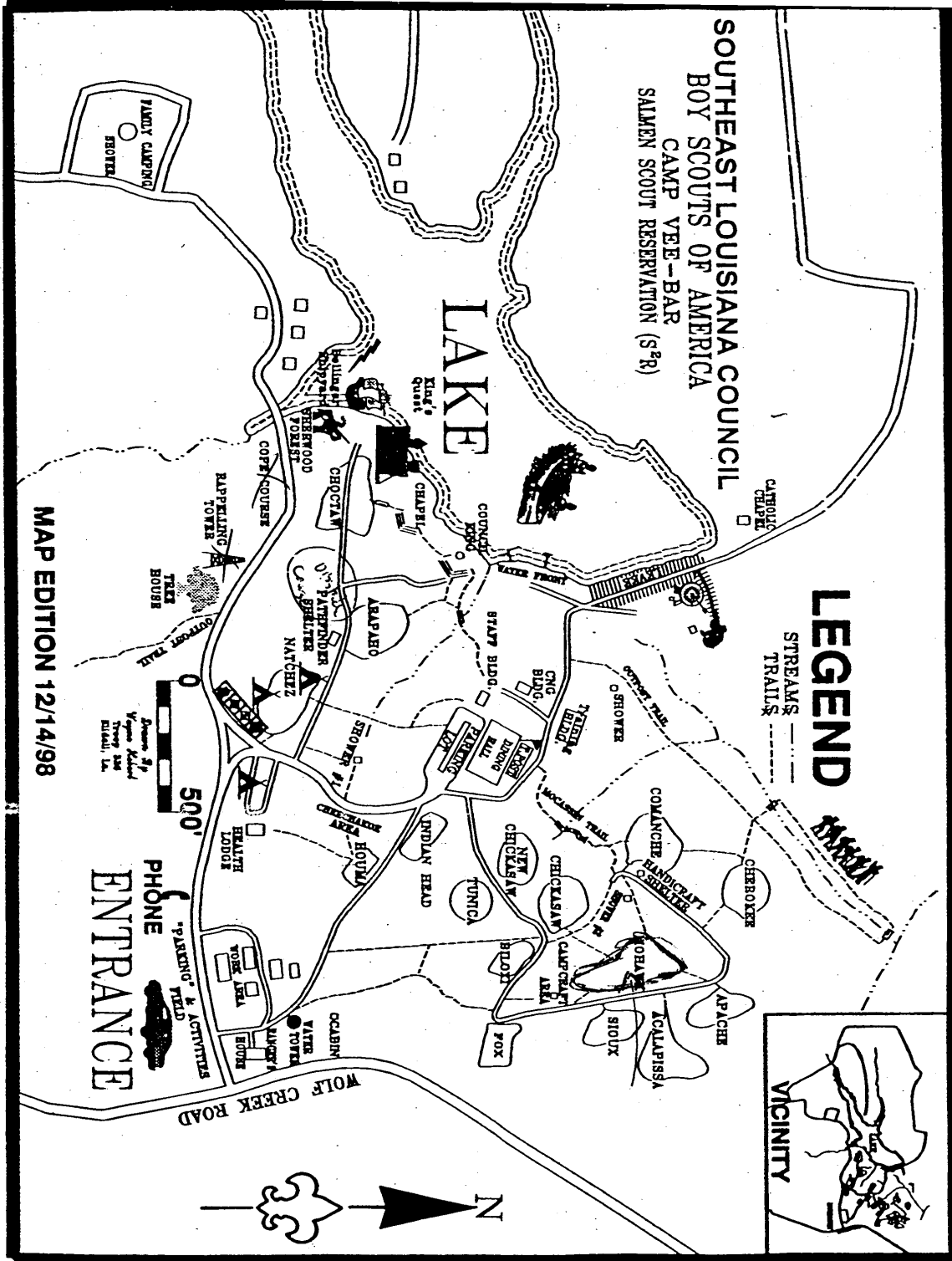

- DIRECTIONS (I-59)**
1. I-10 to Slidell
  2. I-59 to Mississippi Exit 4
  3. Take RIGHT on Hwy 43
  4. Go 10.9 miles till big curve in the road.
  5. Take LEFT on Dummyline Rd.
  6. Go 5.2 miles until road ends.
  7. Take LEFT on Hwy 803.
  8. Go 1.0 mile and turn RIGHT on Standard Dedeaux Rd.
  9. Go 2.1 miles until "Dangerous Curve" in road.
  10. Turn LEFT on Wolf Creek Rd. (road in middle of curve)
  11. Go 1.7 miles until 3-way stop, stay LEFT on V-Bar Rd.
  12. Go 0.6 miles, SSR on LEFT (just past Scenic Trails Campground).
- DIRECTIONS (I-10)**
1. I-10 to Slidell
  2. Continue on I-10 to Mississippi
  3. Go 20.2 miles to Exit 13 (Hwy 603)
  4. Turn LEFT on Hwy 603 (North)
  5. Go 14.6 miles
  6. Look for "VFW Hall & Fire Station" on Right (reference marker)
  7. Turn RIGHT on Standard Dedeaux Rd. (1.0 mile past church).
  8. Go 2.1 miles until "Dangerous Curve" in road.
  9. Turn LEFT on Wolf Creek Rd. (road in middle of curve)
  10. Go 1.7 miles until 3-way stop, stay LEFT on V-Bar Rd.
  11. Go 0.6 miles, SSR on LEFT (just past Scenic Trails Campground).



SLIDELL, LA



We are staying at the Mohawk Campsite. It is located on the upper right hand side of the map across from the Sioux and Acalapissa Campsites (you may park in these campsites if they are not occupied to give us more space). From the entrance road, take the right fork in the road and then take a right after you pass the parking lot for the Dining Hall. Follow this road until it takes a sharp left and Mohawk is on the left.
